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ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

The Administrator has moved to dismiss the appeal filed by the respondent in this proceeding because it was not perfected by the filing of a timely appeal brief, as required by Section 821.48(a) of the Board's Rules of Practice (49 C.F.R. Part 821).¹ We will grant the motion, to which respondent filed no response.

¹ Section 821.48(a) provides as follows:

§ 821.48 Briefs and oral argument.

(a) *Appeal briefs.* Each appeal must be perfected within 50 days after an oral initial decision has been rendered, or 30 days after service of a written initial decision, by filing with the Board and serving on the other party a brief in support of the appeal. Appeals may be dismissed by the Board on its own initiative or on motion of the other party, in cases where a party who has filed a notice of appeal fails to perfect his appeal by filing a timely brief.

The record establishes that respondent filed a timely notice of appeal from the law judge's December 11, 2001 oral initial decision.² However, respondent did not file an appeal brief by February 28, 2002, the date on which his brief, after the grant of an unopposed extension request, was due.

In the absence of good cause to excuse respondent's failure either to perfect his appeal by filing a timely appeal brief or to submit a timely extension request for filing the brief after the deadline, dismissal of his appeal is required by Board precedent. See Administrator v. Hooper, 6 NTSB 559 (1988).

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Administrator's motion to dismiss is granted; and
2. The respondent's appeal is dismissed.

² The law judge affirmed an order of the Administrator suspending respondent's Private Pilot Certificate No. 002610004 for a period of 30 days, for his alleged violation of sections 91.13(a) and 91.151(a)(1) of the Federal Aviation Regulations, 14 CFR Part 91.
