ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

The Commandant has moved to dismiss the appeal filed in this proceeding on the ground that the appellant has failed to perfect his appeal by the timely filing of an appeal brief, as required by section 825.20(e) of the Board's Rules of Procedure for Merchant Marine Appeals.¹ See 49 CFR Part 825. The motion asserts in this connection that appellant's brief was due for

* * * * *

(e) If a party who has filed a notice of appeal does not perfect the appeal by the timely filing of an appeal brief, the Board may dismiss the appeal on its own initiative or on motion of the Coast Guard."

filing on April 6, 1995, following a 30-day extension from its original due date.² No answer to the motion has been received.

As it appears that appellant's appeal is subject to dismissal under the Board's rules and no reason appears for not granting the Commandant's motion, the appeal will be dismissed.³

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The appeal in Docket ME-159 is dismissed.
