The National Transportation Safety Board Training Center will be holding a Night Flying Safety Seminar on **Saturday, December 15, 2018, from 0900 to 1330**. This seminar is the fifteenth in a series of safety seminars all presented by the NTSB, focused on general aviation (GA) accidents. The 4-hour event will explore the benefits and risks of night flying, some of the causes of night flying accidents, and resources available to the pilot community. It is designed for pilots, mechanics and other members of the GA community.

Attendees will experience a unique opportunity, hearing from NTSB investigators regarding how they investigate accidents, and sharing the lessons learned from these accident investigations. We are pleased to have **Adrian Eichorn**, an avid GA and professional airline pilot, speak about operational hazards, physical limitations, and regulations that govern night flying. NTSB Board Member **Earl Weener** will be a featured presenter, and attendees will have the opportunity to ask questions of Member Weener and all the presenters.
